Briefly, the certification process will offer us both challenge and support to improve all aspects of our environmental stewardship, (spiritual, stewardship, communication and environmental-justice). In particular it will help us become systematic in our planning, accountable to our schedule, and much more intentional about our communication and our networking within our congregation and beyond it than we have been.
